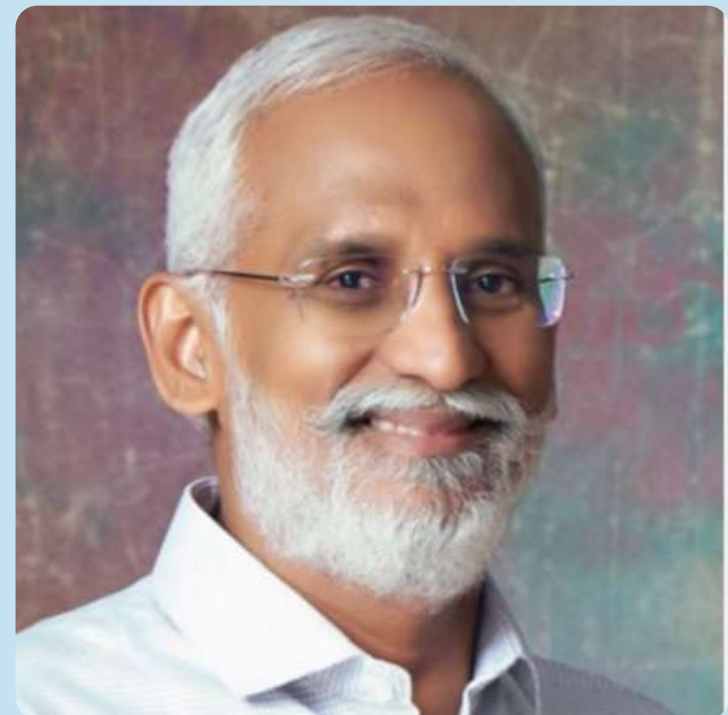

ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

International Research Conclave 2026: Techno-Legal Futures - Integrating Artificial Intelligence, Law and Mathematical Sciences

As artificial intelligence, blockchain, and data-driven decision-making increasingly shape courtrooms, government agencies, and public institutions, the boundary between technology and law has become one of the most consequential frontiers of the digital age. Algorithms now assist in bail decisions, predictive policing, and regulatory compliance; blockchain systems are being tested as tools for evidence management and land records; and mathematical models increasingly guide public policy and resource allocation. Yet the legal, ethical, and governance frameworks needed to manage these technologies are still catching up. This conclave is built around that gap — bringing together legal scholars, technologists, and mathematicians to examine how law, computing, and quantitative reasoning can evolve together responsibly.

The conference happening in **HYBRID MODE** is organized around five interconnected themes. **Responsible AI** explores how systems can be made explainable, fair, and safe for high-stakes use in healthcare, education, and the justice system — asking not just whether AI works, but whether it can be trusted. **Blockchain and Digital Evidence** looks at how decentralized ledgers are reshaping chain-of-custody, courtroom admissibility, and criminal investigations, while raising new questions about privacy and cross-border data sharing. **AI Regulation** surveys the global regulatory landscape — comparing how different countries are legislating around generative AI, algorithmic accountability, and intellectual property in AI-generated content. **Mathematical Optimization in Governance** turns to the quantitative side of public administration, examining how optimization models and predictive analytics can improve disaster response, urban planning, and resource distribution. **Ethical Computing** closes the loop by interrogating the human costs of these technologies — algorithmic bias, surveillance, and the erosion of privacy in an increasingly automated world.

What distinguishes this conclave is its genuinely interdisciplinary framing: it does not treat law as a downstream constraint on technology, nor technology as a mere tool for legal enforcement. Instead, it treats the two as co-evolving systems, best understood through dialogue between jurists, computer scientists, and mathematicians. Sessions are designed to surface friction points where a technically elegant AI system runs into a legal wall, or where a legal doctrine has no natural translation into code — and to use those friction points as starting material for research.

The conclave will run over two days, 2–3 September 2026, structured around paper presentations, keynote addresses from international speakers working at the intersection of AI governance and cybersecurity, and discussion sessions oriented toward practical outcomes rather than purely theoretical debate. Selected papers will be considered for publication in a peer-reviewed, UGC-recognized journal, giving participants a route from conference discussion to lasting scholarly contribution. In bringing law and computing into the same room, the conclave aims to produce not just publishable research, but frameworks that institutions can actually use as AI, blockchain, and mathematical governance tools become part of everyday legal and administrative practice.

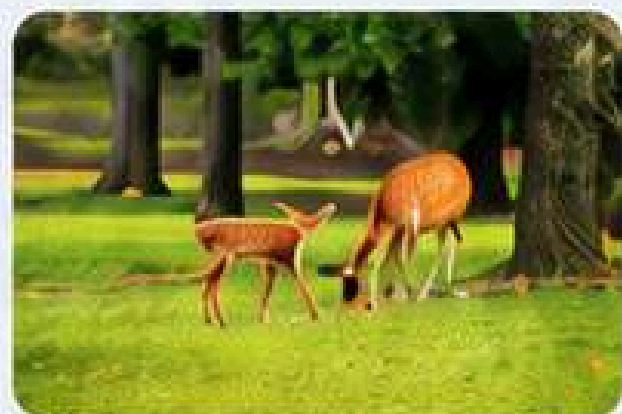

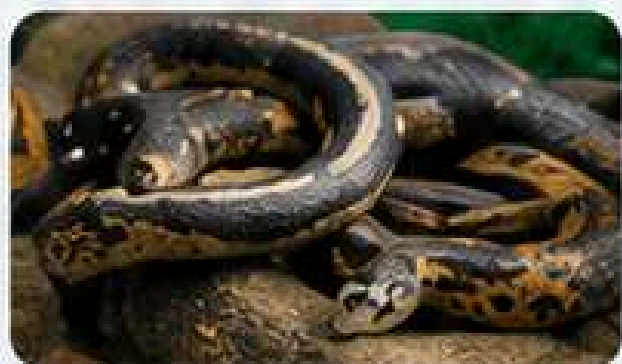
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PLACES TO VISIT IN CHENNAI
